Architecture and psychiatry - spatial mechanisms that promote social cohesion

Description: This interdisciplinary workshop brings together architects and clinicians to discuss the potential of the physical environment to promote social interaction and cohesion in psychiatric facilities. The built environment and the "therapeutic milieu" is known to influence treatment satisfaction and clinical outcomes. Despite growing evidence supporting this influence of architecture on wellbeing, the impact of architecture and design isoften ignored or left to accidental solutions. In this workshop we focus in particular on the question of how the built environment can facilitate meaningful and positive interactions between patients and staff as well as amongst patients. Critical design elements such as spatial typology, entrance narrative, wayfinding and the choice of colour/material will be examined and we will give practical examples of how these factors can actively facilitate meaningful interactions. Furthermore, we will discuss the importance of the design process itself and propose a strucured approach leading to "consensus design". Julia Kirch (Architect) – "Spatial typologies in psychiatric facilities" I will give an overview of typologies that characterize different approaches to building psychiatric facilities and discuss advantages and disadvantages of different layouts. Nikolina Jovanović (MD, Psychiatry/Architect) – "Impact of the built environment on treatment satisfaction of psychiatric in-patients. Jason Danziger (Architect) – "The concept of sociopetal design" I will examine what possibilities spatial elements can offer to support emerging group identities and encourage meaningful interaction between staff and patients as well as the community and reduce stigmatisation. Martin Voss (MD, Psychiatry) – "Consensus Design" I will point out the important role of a thorough planning process in which all stakeholders engage already in early phases of the design process and how this can result in individualised and optimised therapeutic environments, strenghen identity and reduce stigmatisat
